
The Past, Present and Future of the European Skyscraper

There are currently 109 skyscrapers over 150 meters in Europe. This number is set to jump to 161 by the end of 2015, meaning that there are more than 50 projects in advanced construction. This study provides a snapshot of the past, present, and future of the European skyscraper.


Building outlines show the tallest building in 15 European cities.








Note: We can predict 2015 building completions with some accuracy due to projects now in advanced construction.





Seven of the future tallest ten skyscrapers in Europe will be located in Moscow, including the continent's tallest, Vostok Tower.



While only 12% of Europe's 150 meter skyscrapers were mixed-use at the start of 2013, over 30% of the buildings set to complete between 2013 and 2015 are mixed-use skyscrapers.



Europe's current tallest, The Shard, will only enjoy the title for a few months, soon to be surpassed by Moscow's Mercury City Tower.
